January is License Time

All license renewals with the Town of New Castle are due in January. Anyone who has not yet renewed licenses should do so by the end of the month.

Dog licenses are required for all dogs living in town limits. Wearing their tags lets dogs carry their proof of vaccination with them, as well as a unique number get them get home if they wander. The license fee for a spayed or neutered dog is \$10, and photos of the dogs and rabies certificates are required.

Business and contractor licenses are also due. All businesses physically located in town, as well as those doing business in New Castle, should renew in January. The cost for a business license is \$25. Applicants need to provide proof of liability and workers compensation insurance plus any required state licenses (such as master electrician, master plumber, registered/certified manufactured home installer, etc).

A Back Fence for New Castle

Lions Place Eyeglass Collection Boxes

Thanks to a discretionary grant from the Board of Council Commissioners, the New Castle Lions have purchased and placed three outdoor eyeglass collection boxes. Hearing aids can also be recycled. The boxes are located in front of the library, outside Edward Jones in New Castle Plaza and at the Silt Medical Clinic.

Once collected, the lenses are analyzed, sorted and placed in inventory. Then the Lions make them available for distribution to optical missions around the world. The Lions Club International has made eyesight its central mission since 1925. Besides recycling eyeglasses, the New Castle Lions provide eligible applicants with financial support for eye exams and conduct exams in elementary schools. Anyone interested in helping the Lions with their vision projects or any of the other ways they serve the community can attend a meeting on the second Tuesday of each month at 6:30, at First Baptist Church.

The Town of New Castle will hold a regular municipal election on April 5, 2022, to fill the positions of Mayor and three councilors for four-year terms. Mayor Art Riddile and Councilors Bruce Leland, Brandy Copeland and Scott Owens are completing their terms this year.

To appear on the ballot, candidates must submit a nomination petition with the signatures of fifteen registered voters. Petitions can be picked up at the Clerk's office in Town Hall on Tuesday, January 4 and must be turned in by 5:00 p.m. on Monday, January 24, 2022. The Clerk will also provide an election handbook for candidates.
