The approximately 20' by 20' building is not representative of a particular style of architecture. Overall, the building is a No Style building. The building incorporates a stacked stone foundation; a stone masonry exterior envelope; a shed roof clad in corrugated metal; overhanging eaves; and three small vent openings. The main entryway is located in the center of the primary (south) elevation and incorporates a vertical weatherboard door with wrought iron hinges.

Prior historical documentation indicates that the shed roof was replaced by 1992.

14. Associated buildings, features, or objects: Another resource is located on the far west side of the property. This building is known as the former New Castle Town Hall and Hose House is associated with 5GF.1665. This resource is evaluated independently from 5GF.1665.







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


Description: 1899 Sanborn Fire Insurance map of the resource. The property is outlined in red. The building is shaded in blue.
