

ARCHITECTURAL DESCRIPTION: One-story front gable roofed building in cruciform shape, with intersecting projecting gables on rear; small, lower, hipped roof rear projection. Standing seam metal roofing and widely overhanging eaves. Walls composed of poured concrete; concrete foundation. Upper front gable end has coursed wood shingles and round window with what appears to be modern stained glass with cross. Side gables also have coursed shingles. Projecting, gabled, enclosed entrance bay is frame, with drop siding, overhanging eaves with exposed rafters, and paneled double doors; wood cross above doors. Gothic pointed arch windows with amber and colored glass; large windows at ends of intersecting gables on east and west. Chimney of orange brick on south side of eastern gable.
